### History 1562-1582

#### Joan Ribault Claims Florida for France

In 1562, Jean Ribault (pronounced RY-baw) was sent to Florida to establish a colony for France. He was the first European to set foot on the Florida peninsula. He was also the first to claim the land for France. He was killed by the Spanish in 1565.

Ribault landed on the St. Augustine



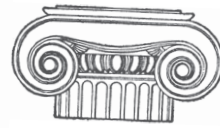
During the time that Jean Ribault was in prison, René de Laudonnière (born At age ten (the 1540)) was sent to prison in Carolina in South Carolina. Laudonnière led an expedition of 200 Huguenot soldiers. The Huguenots were ordered about meeting at a some colony where they would have limited to working. Life was difficult for the Protestant Huguenots in Catholic France.

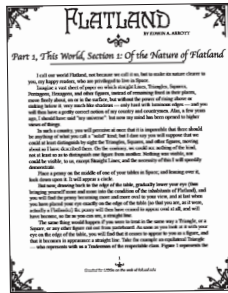
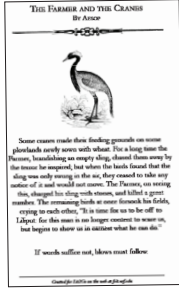
