The Entrance of the Amelia, lay in the Lat<sup>d</sup> of 30°. 14' N. Long<sup>d</sup> 81. 20' W. 5 from the Merid<sup>n</sup> of London Varied 2°. 0' West Laying 40 Leag<sup>s</sup> to the North<sup>w</sup> of S<sup>t</sup>. Augustine Barr, and 21 Leag<sup>s</sup> to the South<sup>w</sup> of Georgia Barr. In coming off this Barr its very Necessary, to know the time of Tide, which the Roman Figures shewest, at full and Change if it happens to be Low Water, there is fine Anchoring without the Barr, in 6 and 7 Fath<sup>s</sup>, good holding Ground, the Barr is a hard Sand, the Shoals full dotted are dry at Low Water, The Wind on shore, makes a Terrible surge all a Crofs, but still tis preferable to Cha<sup>s</sup>. Town Barr, in Carolina.

- E. The Leading Mark in the Passon, which I Erected over looks all the Trus, the Trus a Saile Breadth to the Northward, you are in the best of the Channel, Course in is Why N. till within the Inner Brake, then open a Cluster of Trees on Tiger Island.
- F. North Channel, carrying no more then 6 feet at L<sup>w</sup> Water.
- G. Tiger Creek, figures mark'd in them, are feet, at low Water.
- H. Bells Creek.
- I. Woodlands Creek.
- K. Entrance of S<sup>t</sup>. Marys River, the figures there are fathoms, the Leading mark for the North Channel, is some High Pines, on the South End of Tiger Is. Sc. land'd in one the Tides Common Tides of S<sup>t</sup>. Sprin<sup>g</sup> Tides 7'. In the Mark Runs at the Rate of 3 Knots.
